Vice President – Vote for one

Sana Haroon, Associate Professor, History/Asian Studies

I am an associate professor serving a second term as tenured faculty representative to the Ex-Comm. In Ex-Comm I serve on the salary anomaly committee and have taken steps to understand and address challenges faced by international faculty.

I believe that the most pressing issues faced by each of our members lie at the intersection of our personal and civic lives and the conditions in which we work.
